



Fifteen years after Porter & Coates became heir to the Alger properties, Henry T. Coates & Company succeeded Porter & Coates, continuing the pattern of originating titles and reissuing old ones. Ralph D. Gardner. *Horatio Alger, or The American Hero Era.* The Wayside Press, 1964.

On 25 October 1902 Coates sold the retail book business to the John Wanamaker department store, and in 1903 the stationary division and manufacturing plant went to the G. W. Jacobs Company. The publishing business of approximately one thousand titles, plates, stock, and copyrights was sold to John C.
