





This company was owned and operated by Frank Moore Lupton (1854-1910). He established F. M. Lupton Publishing in 1882. It was incorporate as F. M. Lupton Publishing Company in 1892. The name was changed to "The Federal Book Company" in 1902 with sole focus on books. They were situated at 23-27 City Hall Place, NY. The company went out of business in 1904.
